DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entering in Members' classes or competing for Member's Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class

i.e. – 13TH JANUARY 2012

Wins in variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1. **WITHDRAWAL** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 9(j) and 20.

2. **TRANSFER** (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or a Puppy class for which it is over-age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy or Junior class respectively to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS :For owner, handler or exhibitor not having won a Challenge Certificate, at a Championship Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not a Challenge Certificates or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not

LIMIT: For dogs which have not won three Challenge Certificates under three different judges or seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

SPECIAL VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show

SPECIAL BROOD BITCH: Having Kennel Club registered progeny

SHOW REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 10.00 am
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. Exhibits may not be removed any earlier unless by written order of the Veterinary Surgeon, Veterinary Practitioner or of the Show Manager and then only in very exceptional and unforeseen circumstances which must be reported to the Kennel Club. The show will close half hour after all judging has been completed.
5. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete Number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete Number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
6. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the Show venue is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
7. ENTRY FEE Members per dog First Class or NFC £4 Non Members per dog First Class or NFC £5. Each subsequent Class with same dog £1
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is prohibited.
11. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW will be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the Show. A puppy is a dog of six months and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show. Where Best in Show is a Puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow selection of Best in Show.
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show however must not compete in any subsequent competition See proviso.
12. BEST IN SHOW The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from exhibits declared Best of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show however must not compete in any subsequent competition See proviso
- PROVISO FOR RULE 13 & 14 For the purpose of these Regulations dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood bitch, Progeny, Brace, and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging.
14. No modification will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisements in the Canine Press wherever possible.
15. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at or for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules & Show Regulations and by these regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are accepted.
16. The Show will be held under K.C. Rules and Regulations in force at the date of publication of the Schedule.
17. The Club nor its Officers and Committee will not be responsible for any claim for injury or compensation or loss of property occasioned by or arising out of holding of the Show or by reason of act or default of any person in attendance or present there at.
18. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F Annex B Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
19. Any owner exhibitor handler or person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event, including car parks and approaches. Any organisation holding a Kennel Club Licensed event is required to provide an adequate number of receptacles for the disposal of such fouling.
20. The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for competition owing to disease savage disposition or any other case not in a fit state for exhibition and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged the entry fee will be forfeited K.C.Reg. 15.
21. No dog other than those entered for the Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Hall whilst the Show is in progress
22. The Committee reserve the right not to refund any entry or admission fees in the event of the Show not being held due to forces beyond their control

The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered for exhibition and for any property entrusted to it, but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and any other persons that the

Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss, or detention of, or damage to any dog or person for any cause whatsoever, nor for any act or omission of themselves, their officers, servants, agents and others, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.

Exhibitors are responsible for the cleaning up of any fouling by their dogs

For safety reasons cages may only be placed in designated areas of the Hall

The Kennel Club is concerned that an individual who purchases a product from a Trade Stand at a Kennel Club Licensed Show might assume, perhaps incorrectly, that the use of the product would not contravene Kennel Club Regulation f. The Committee of this Show can accept no responsibility for the products advertised or sold by stall holders at any Show, and remind exhibitors that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1 These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club

Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.

2 (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for

any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.

(b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not

be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:

(a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.

(b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.

(c) The shortening of tails of customarily docked breeds but only up to an acceptable age limit which shall be prescribed from time to time.

(d) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered

dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show.

Any

examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing

in the same breed or class, an objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official

(as

appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of

identity

at the time of lodging the complaint.

7 (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.

(b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these
